"In Alexandre Pépin's light-infused paintings — which I first encountered several years ago in his graduate MFA studio — a series of semi-abstract figures and shapes emerge and recede in a quiet symphony of color, pattern, and texture. To some degree, his technique is an exercise in restraint, as he frequently allows aspects of raw burlap to peek through or leaves an image deliberately underworked, generating a delicious sense of mystery. "Annice Fell is an up-and-coming London-based abstract painter who has been on my radar for some time. I am mesmerised by her process where she uses a technique developed by Surrealist artist Max Ernst, in which paint is spread onto a plastic sheet and, while still wet, transferred onto the canvas or paper, creating a mono-print that can be built upon with the artist's brush. This approach to composition is akin to automatic writing and allows the artist to plunge into her subconscious and create something without any inhibitions. The end results are these incredibly bold and atmospheric paintings with a colour palette that is unique to each work and dynamic brush work that keeps one's eye moving at a steady clip. 
